I am happy to remind all of us that the NAAC Peer Team visited the College on the 9th and 10th of February 2023 and awarded the College with the highest grade of A++ valid for 5 years. Our grateful thanks to Dr Vibha Sharma, Dr Aditya Pratap Deo and the team which worked tirelessly especially the young ad-hoc teachers. This year we were disappointed to note that we stood at number 14 on an all-India basis in the NIRF rankings. One of the findings for our poor ranking was that our research output was rather low and this was the single, largest impediment in our slipping down the ranks. I am happy to say that the IQAC and the College has started taking corrective measures towards setting right this lacuna.

The second Young Leaders Neighbourhood-first Fellowship programme concluded on the 30th of May 2023. 21 participants from seven different countries attended the programme. College would like to place on record its thanks to the Ministry of External Affairs, GoI for the support and encouragement provided to the YLNF programme. Dr Bertram Devadas was appointed full-time Director for the Centre for Advanced Learning.

Admissions to the UG programmes in College were conducted per the directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi's decision of September 2022. Accordingly, admission interviews were conducted only for the applicants from the Christian minority category. We have approached the Supreme Court of India in the matter of admissions and are awaiting the next hearing. College decided not to participate in the PG admission this last year on account of the harassment meted out to PG applicants from College who had been selected from College and have had to go to court to ask for a fair distribution of PG seats to the College. I am grateful for the support that Dr Malay Neerav and Dr Annu Malhotra provided as Tutors for Admission. The IT department continues to support not only the admissions but also the efforts of the College to go completely paperless. College now follows the NEP and all UG programmes are now 4-year long degrees.

A direct result of the NEP is the urgent need for more classrooms. The College is making all efforts to increase the number of classroom. The main building of the College is over 80 years old and is now in dire need of repairs and maintenance. I am happy to inform you that we have been granted clearance to carry out repairs and we are assisted in this by INTACH. Repairs will soon begin. Funding is however very essential and may I request donors, philanthropists and generous-minded individuals to come forward and donate towards the repair and maintenance of this heritage structure which has such good memories for so many of us.

The end-of-semester exams were conducted on time I am grateful to my colleagues in the departments of Chemistry, Economics, English and History for the work they have undertaken. The work would not have been possible without the hard work of our non-teaching and support staff.

The College has been forced to file a Writ Petition in the Court with regard to the appointment/reappointment of the Principal which the University has chosen to bring up as an issue stalling further processing our teaching vacancies in blatant disregard of the College's minority status. The promotions of faculty and the vacant teaching positions continue to remain unfilled on account of this disregard of the University for the important matters of the College.

College however, fulfilled its obligations to an institution that we along with two other Colleges founded and therefore participated in the centenary celebrations of the University of Delhi. We put up a stall indicating our role in the establishment of the University and the many whom college have given to the University both as administrators and academics over the past 100 years.

Revd Dr Monodeep Daniel who served as Dean, Residence and Chaplain of the College since 2008 and in May this year he laid down both those offices. College wishes to place on record his services and gratefully acknowledges his contributions to the College. I am happy to inform all of us that Revd Samuel Shekar has been appointed as full-time Chaplain of the College with effect from 1 July 2023.

The following colleagues retired this past year – Ms Nandita Narain, Dr Jacob Cherian and Dr A D Mathur. College gratefully remembers their years of service to the College as teachers.

It is with great sadness that I place on record the passing away of our former colleagues – Dr Tasneem Suhrawardy, Dr Tara Chand and Dr Vig. We pray that their souls rest in peace and offer our condolences to the families.

College continues to follow up with the UGC with regard to our application for autonomy, first made in 2017.

Arrears of pensioners and regular teaching staff of the College which have been long-pending have been followed up successfully by the Bursar's office and the arrears have now been released.

Between the 23rd of November and the 29th of November, 2023 the Principal visited Japan to renew our association with Soka University, Japan and deliver the Keynote address at the annual conference of the South Asian

Research Centre of Soka University. The Principal also made use of the opportunity to visit other Universities in Japan and as a result of this we now have a collaboration with the Kansai Gaidai University and a possible collaboration with yet another Japanese institution. I am grateful for the help and support offered by Prof Mukesh Williams and Dr Ui Teramoto whose preparatory ground work has been very helpful in paving the way for these partnerships.

Founder's Day of the College was observed on the 7th of December. Our Chief Guest was Ms Rebecca Mathai, Deputy Comptroller and Auditor General, Government of India.

Adoremus, the annual Christmas service was held on the 10th and 11 of December. Easter lunch was celebrated on 29th April, 2024.

The College's alumni office continues to do well; we now have registered alumni offices in Calcutta, Japan and Washington with other groups and regions evincing a keen interest to start such registered Chapters. The 1994 Batch of the College had provided an Art Space in the College and it has now been dedicated to the memory of the Late Dr. Anil Wilson, Past Principal of the College. The alumni of Nagaland assisted College in setting up the David Baker Memorial Archives. The second Annual St Stephen's – MRF Distinguished Alumni Lecture was held on 2nd April, 2024 where Mr Piyush Gupta delivered the address. The batch of 1992 has, through a 25 lakh donation decided to support the College's desire to green with an off-site solar unit for the College. This was commissioned in April 2024. We are very grateful for the dedicated services of Dr Ann Susan Aleyas who has unfortunately had to move on.

Today, for our young men and women who have spent 3 long years in college., who have had experiences which are not limited to their books alone, I urge them to think of what they can do to deserve the title of peacemakers in the world. This does not mean that you must go to the warzone, this does not mean that you should stop your studies. This does not mean that you must quit your responsibilities and merely hold a placard which says you need Peace. Rather, you must through your thoughts, your gentle words

and through your actions which reflect that gentleness, you must spur our leaders, our elders and our future generations towards Peace. And therefore as you go out to take your final set of exams I wish you the peace and calmness of mind that comes from above. The peace that will tell you that You are strong to face the challenges that are there before you; be that in the examination hall, or be that in the big, wide world. Be confident because your parents, your family, your teachers and this College have taught you to be true, to be honest, to be faithful so that each one of you and us will be deserving of that crown which embellishes our College crest. You have been taught to be confident and you have also been taught to be humble. You have been taught to excel at what you do and you have also been taught that your excellence is to be shared.
