The Asian Parliamentary Exhibition Debate:


- The workshop and exhibition debate was organised on 17th January, 2023 in the college hall to introduce the format of Asian Parliamentary debating to students of the college.

• Panel Discussion: "Questioning the capitalist, able bodied notion of love"

- The panel discussion was organised in collaboration with the Enabling Unit of our college, which was held on 8th April, 2023 at 3 PM in the AV Room.
- The panellists were Nu (They/Them), a queer, disabled non-binary person and the founder of UN recognized Revival Disability India, Garima (they/them), an agender disabled person and Aish, an artist with masters in Visual Arts from Ambedkar university who works as an illustrator or curator for mental health and disability.
- The panellists through an interactive session allowed the audience to ponder upon the privilege able bodied-ness rendered in everyday, and how even within the spectrum of disability, the notion of visibility starkly differentiates individuals' experiences.
