Enactus Project Trishna


Enactus, St. Stephen's College took up Project Trishna -which involves the production of low-cost water filters made using sustainable material- in an attempt

to uplift the poor communities in areas affected by the water crisis by helping them achieve a healthier living state.

We researched the ongoing water crisis in India and how it is affecting people, with a special focus on Delhi- NCR regions.

We identified the target regions facing a severe water crisis and set up our target community accordingly.

- We researched the specific ratios of silver, clay and dust used to make the model.
- We reached out to the potter community for the production of our prototype.
- We made 5 water filters containing different ratios of silver and clay to test for efficiency.
- We contacted governmental and private laboratories to test our filtered water sample.
- Our team undertook a **field visit in October 2021** to the **Delhi Jal Board** where research and understanding of the process of testing were undertaken. A careful analysis of the costs involved was also done so that we could figure out the costs as per our needs and requirements.
- The filtered samples are now in the process of testing.





Enactus Project Nuri

Enactus, St. Stephen's College took up Project Nuri-which involved the production of pickles

and other preservatives - in an attempt to uplift the poor communities, especially old age women by helping them achieve an economically better-living state.

We managed to achieve the following through the means of our initiative:

- Proper ideation and appropriate research and testing related to the raw material and their ratio used were carried out.
- Target communities were approached to set up the project.
- A list of potential NGOs along with the proposal is ready.

- Plan of action- these NGOs will soon be contacted with our project proposal and will start developing the project business plan with the NGO that is ready to collaborate with us.
- We aim to create a self-sustainable business model with the NGO to establish a circular income flow model with our target community.
- The initial support in form of capital and other professional support will be provided by team Enactus, St. Stephen's College till the project reaches the self-sustainable level.



Project Chirag

Enactus, St. Stephen's College, organized Project Chirag in October'22. On the occasion of Diwali, Enactus decided to bring smiles to the women of the potter

community by incentivizing their work as we bought diyas in bulk and conducted a diya painting event in the SCR lawns.

- The competition consisted of two rounds:

- The Theme was "No Poverty' and Any Other Two SDGs"
- All the event publicity was done through online modes on platforms such as Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn.
- We received 52 registrations for the competition. A total of 15 students were shortlisted after the prelims for the final round. They were then called for the final which was held offline within the college campus where they had to present their project.
- We chose one winning proposal after careful consideration and deliberations with all Enactus team members.

Fungi Thrive on Stubble

- Mushroom cultivation is becoming increasingly popular among farmers. Not only does it offer a new stream of income, but it also has a positive impact on the environment by utilizing agricultural waste as a substrate for growth.
- The cultivation of mushrooms is also relatively easy and requires minimal resources, making it an accessible option for farmers with limited land or financial resources.



Cultivating Mushrooms from Stubble



Mushroom Cultivation

- Mushroom cultivation from stubble involves using the agricultural waste left after harvesting as a substrate for growing mushrooms.
- The stubble is chopped, mixed with other organic materials, and then sterilized before being inoculated with mushroom spores.
- Mushrooms are then grown on this substrate providing a sustainable and profitable alternative for farmers.

All the people were divided into teams of three. 7 teams were formed.



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
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We expect to impact 40 members of the community directly, 200 indirectly and even more when the project is made self-sufficient.
