Event I: "Political Economy of Populism: A case Study of West Bengal"

Date: 15 September 2023

Resource person(s): Professor Zaad Mehmood, Presidency University

No. of participants: 47

Prof. Zaad Mahmud, Associate Professor of Political Science at Presidency University had delivered the aforementioned talk on the 15th of September as a part of the inaugural event for the academic year 2023-2024. The lecture was attended by at least 47 guests, both from within, and outside of the institution. Prof. Mahmud skillfully unravelled for us the silent shift that had taken place within the 'governing class' of West Bengal over the last half a century. His conclusion, supported by an array of technical data, was equally thought provoking— in West Bengal, we find locally influential petty business people (cutting across religious and caste lines) identifying as social workers, increasingly taking part in the electoral process, who are neither entrepreneurs nor industrialists. An engaging question-answer session followed his talk.

Event II: Walk to the Partition Museum

A walk to the Partition Museum in the Ambedkar University Campus was organised in collaboration with the Punjabi Literary Society on the 26th of September, 2023. About 17 students from various courses signed up for the event. On the way to the Museum, the walk covered the St. James Church as well as the Kashmere Gate Campus of St. Stephen's College, currently the Chief Electoral Office of Delhi.

Themes covered in the walk include the importance of oral history, the different roles of women during partition, the role of Chittoprasad in capturing the tragedies of the partition, the Namasudra migration. The portrayal of the Partition in popular Bengali media such as Ritwik Ghatak's Partition Trilogy (*Meghe Dhaka Tara, Komal Gandhar, Subarnarekha*) was also discussed.




Event III: "Bengali Modernisms: Three Encounters"

Dr. Brinda Bose of the Centre for English Studies, JNU, delivered a talk on modernism, as evident in three pieces of Bengali media on the 6th of October, 2023. It was attended by 23 guests. She discussed Ashish Avikunthak's films that draw on Samuel Beckett's plays such as *Kalkimanthankatha* and how he saw it as a palimpsest and not a derivative of *Waiting for Godot*. The materiality of the text as the human body in *Kalkimanthankatha* or the very pages of the book in Benoy Majumdar's *Phire Esho Chaka* assume an importance given their modernist tendencies. The third text Dr. Bose discussed was Ritwik Ghatak's unfinished documentary on the iconic artist Ramikinkar Baij and the materiality of the same. The discussion was followed by an extended question-answer session.








Event V: Bangla Lunch 2023-2024
