The finalist teams were given a case prompt on the spot to prepare and present a case on the theme 'Access to Education in Conflict Zones.' The teams were supposed to propose feasible solutions to develop innovative strategies to integrate psychosocial support programs into educational systems to address the trauma and mental health needs of students in these areas. They also addressed the question of how technology be leveraged to bridge the gap in educational access and the role international organizations can play in supporting and facilitating access to education for children displaced by conflict. The participants designed policy changes needed at the national and international levels to prioritize and safeguard the right to education.

The teams tabled very insightful and intriguing presentations displaying their policymaking acumen. Thereafter, the judge Mr. Sachin Kumar shared his views on the theme and gave suggestions to the participants on how they can improve their presentations to hone their policymaking skills. This crisis case competition served as a beacon of light for future policymakers to deal with the problems faced by the international community.


### Leadership Conference Day 2 of 3: Screening of Documentary "Reason" and Q&A Session with Anand Patwardhanj




