FOUNDER'S DAY


DATE: 7th DECEMBER 2023 LOCATION: ST. STEPHEN'S COLLEGE

Conducted a yoga quiz to enhance the cadets' knowledge and understanding of various aspects of yoga.








3. MEDITATION SESSION

4. Game with Cadets: Yoga Asanas


A fun and interactive game session was organized with the cadets to engage them in practicing different yoga asanas.






1. Drill Competition (DST)


4. Three-Legged Race/Buddy Pair Race

All the events will be actively covered by our cadets and will be posted on our social media handles to bring in the feeling of patriotism and pride for the nation among the viewers.






REPORT: ENROLLMENT OF FIRST YEARS

REPORT: MILITARY HOSPITAL ATTACHMENT CAMP


