Ms. Shruti noted the complexity of decision-making and the various inputs involved. The lecture was followed by an engaging Q&A session, where students explored the roles of multilateral institutions. Ms. Lakhtakia highlighted their evolving nature and distinct functions. Ms. Shruti also discussed how ecosystem research can lead to academic or policy interests and encouraged seizing research opportunities. She spoke about the role of college in career exploration. In summary, the lecture provided valuable insights and enriched students' understanding.



Brief Description of Event: The final round of the Policy Drift, the Policy Drafting Competition within Policy Conclave, the annual mini-fest organized by The Planning Forum, took place at NPLT, Science Block, St. Stephen's College on February 7, 2024. In partnership with the Takshashila Institution, a Bengaluru-based public policy school, the competition included two online rounds: a preliminary quiz with participation from over 295 students across the country, and a subsequent workshop led by Mr. Sarthak Pradhan, an Assistant Professor at Takshashila Institution. Following these rounds, seven teams qualified for the offline round held at the college. Mr. Madhu Sivaraman, Consultant at DPIIT, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, GOI, Mr. Abhishek Saxena, former public policy expert at NITI Aayog and Mr. Nipun Rathi, public policy specialist at OPPO were the judges of the final round. For the final round, the problem statement was provided by Takshashila Institution to which the finalists prepared their presentation. They were given 10 minutes each to present their solutions, followed by a 5 minutes Q&A round by the judges.

Brief Description of Event: The final round of Case Crunch, the policy based case study competition of Policy Conclave, the annual mini-fest of The Planning Forum was conducted at AV Room, St. Stephen's College. The competition was organised in collaboration with The Indian School of Public Policy (ISPP), a premier public policy institute. Prior to the offline final round, there were two online rounds- a preliminary quiz round which saw participation from 380+ teams and the subsequent online submission round by the 20 shortlisted teams. Out of these, 8 teams made it to the offline final round. Dr. Imran Amin, Fellow and Academic Coordinator at ISPP and Mr. Manu Sakunia, Head of Admissions at ISPP were the judges for the final round. In the finals, which commenced at 2 PM, the top 8 teams presented their solution to the given case problem in 7 minutes, which was followed by a Q&A round by the judges. After an extremely insightful and thorough round of presentations, Team Banerjee and Duflo (St. Stephen's College) emerged victorious. They were followed by Team ANA (Shri Ram College of Commerce) and Team Niti Kalyan (Miranda House) as the runners up. The members of these 3 teams were awarded certificates by the judges. Following the announcement of the results, the judges gave constructive feedback to all teams and explained other potential approaches to tackle the problem. The event wrapped up by 5 PM.
