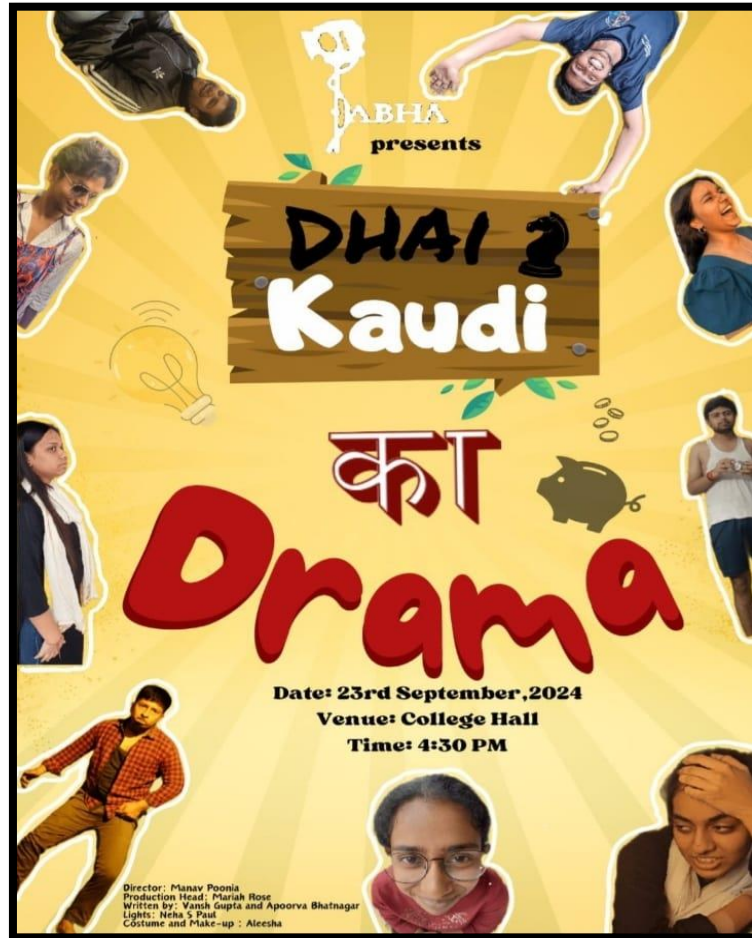

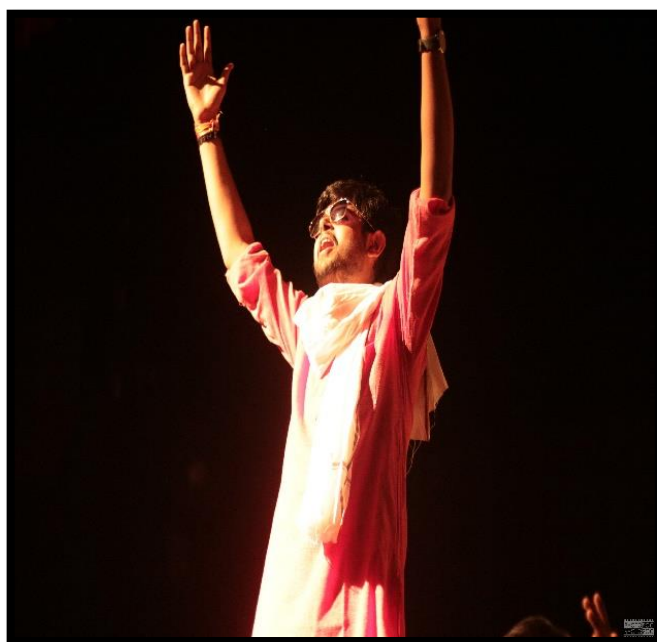

Date: February 19, 2025

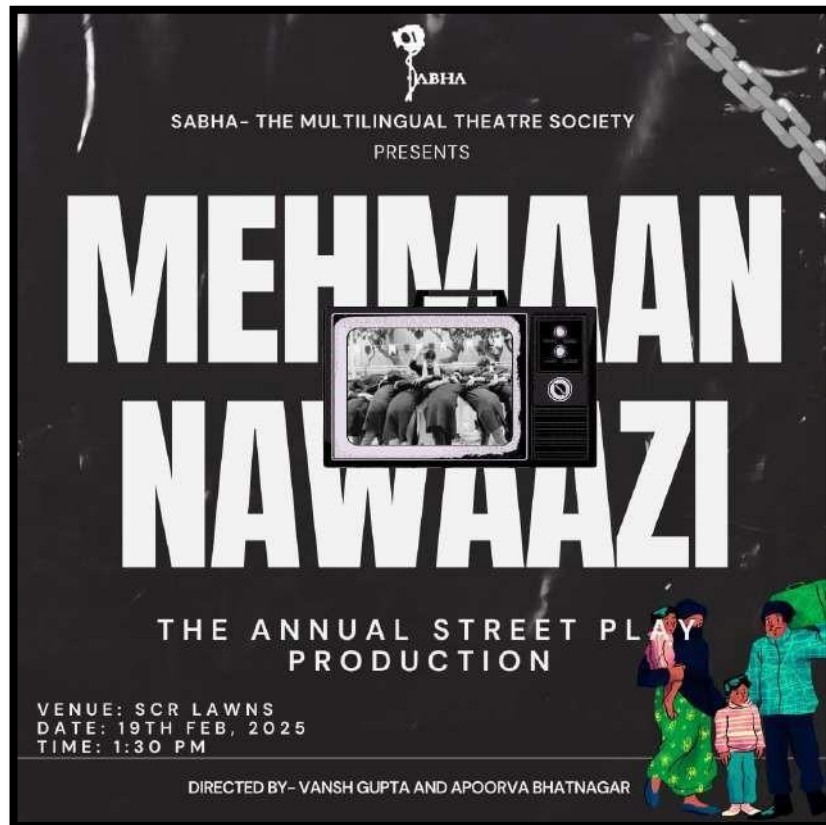
Brief description of the event:

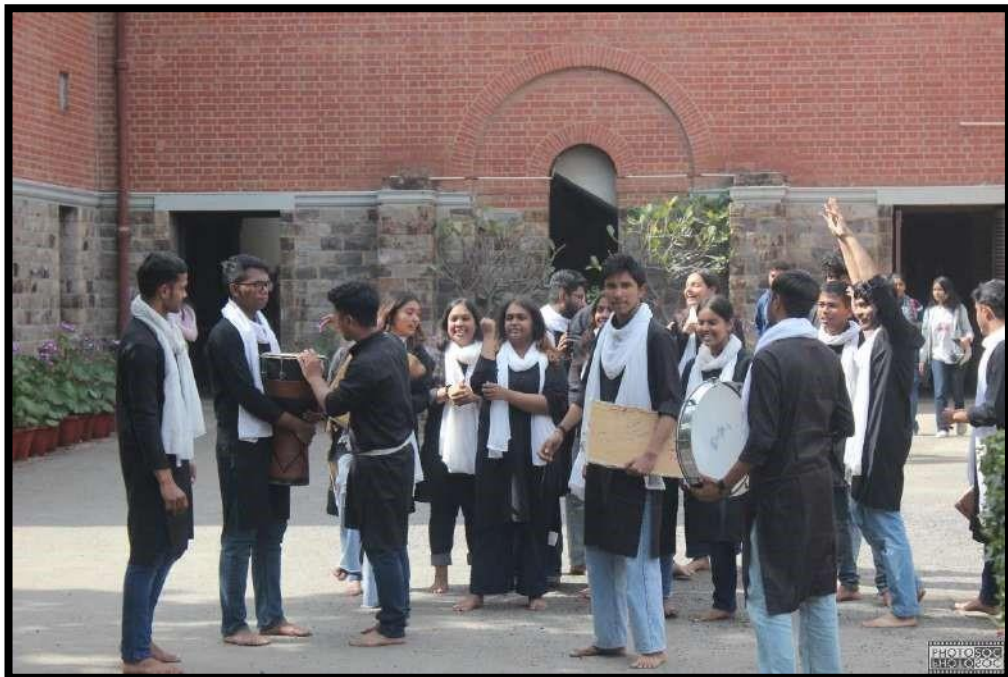

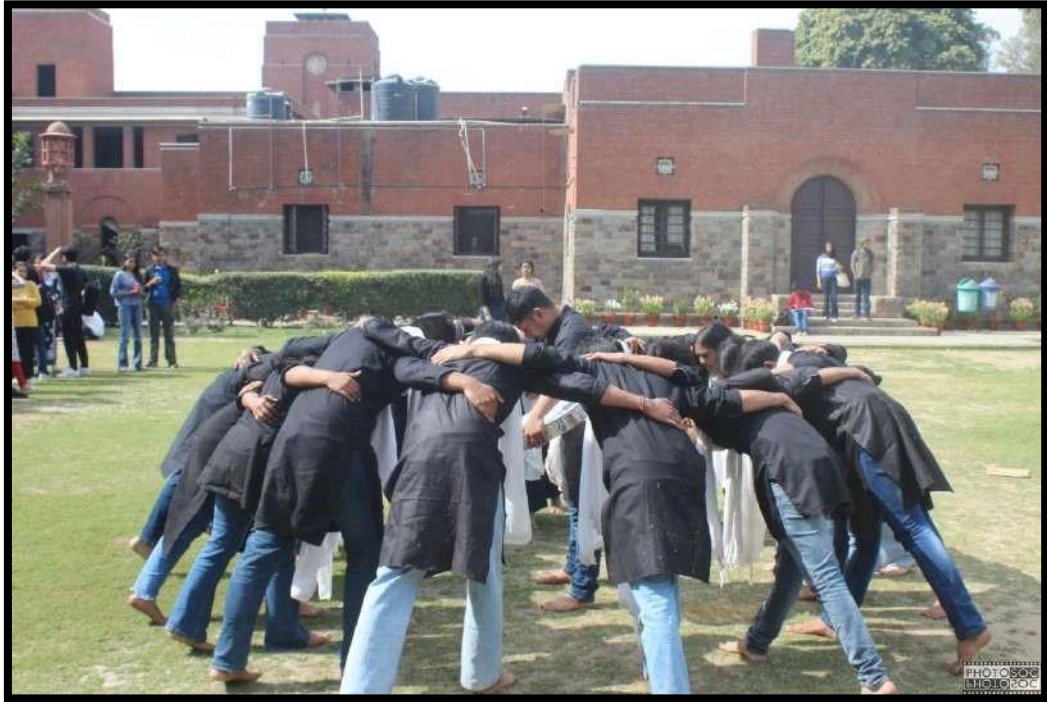

It showed the struggles of people who are forced to leave their homes and how they are treated by the societies they move to. The play encouraged the audience to think about how we treat outsiders and the importance of empathy and human rights.

The performance was full of energy, with strong acting, group coordination, and traditional street play elements like music, chorus, and minimal props. The open-air setting of the SCR Lawns helped attract a large and attentive audience.

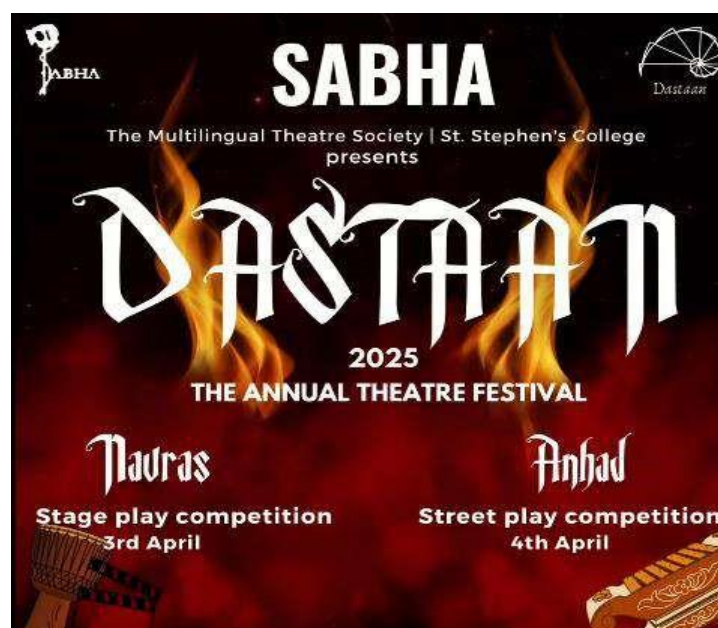
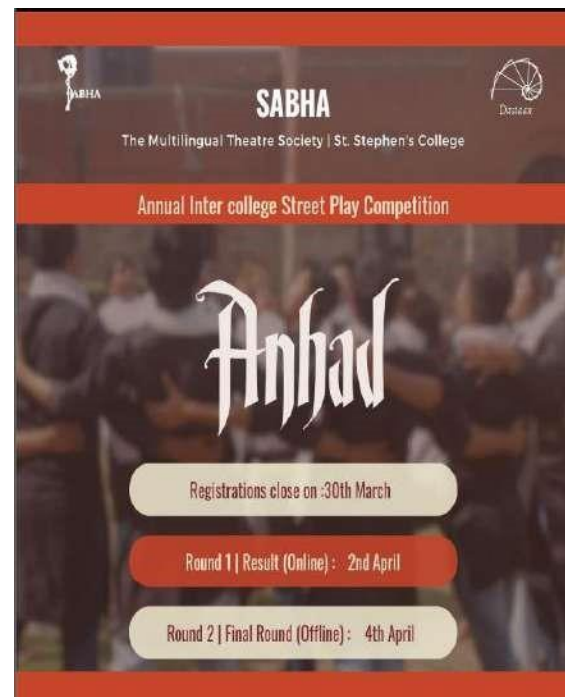
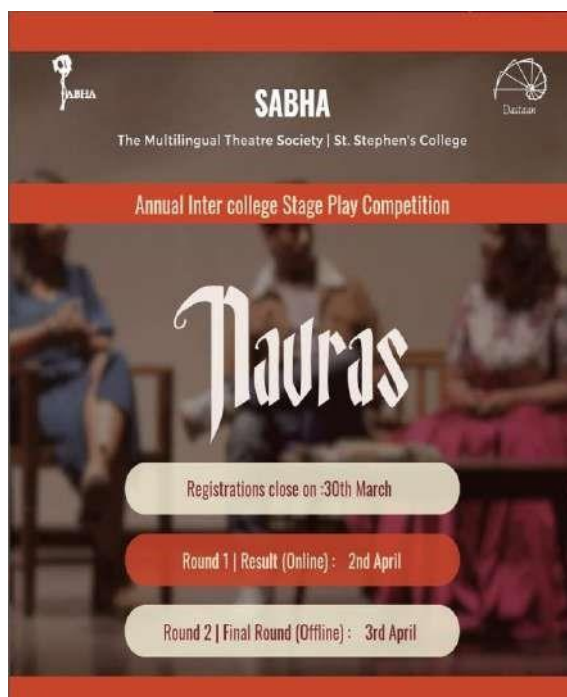
